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## PASTOR's $\mathcal{M E S S A G E}$

My In-Laws live in a very large retirement community. (How large is it?) No joke, it is so large, that they have their very own churches-just about every denomination! They even have a UCC church. One Sunday while visiting, I attended that congregational church. They didn't have Sunday School! They didn't even try. It's a retirement community-they pretty much only had one or two generations represented-and they weren't interested in nursery care, and they never lamented the lack of children. I love that our congregation is made up of many generations. It certainly presents challenges.
During Lent, we are going on a pilgrimage of sorts. I am going to be pulling back the_curtain on the generations that make up our church. We live in a world that is constantly dividing us. We have labels thrust upon us. Algorithms have made the separation even greater-and pulled us closer to the extremes.
Throughout the season of Lent, I will be separating us by generation. This is to show the variety of ages and influences of our congregation. It may help to answer why the church is the way it is today. It should certainly help us to understand where we are going, and who is going with us.
Throughout the sermons of Lent, I will be speaking in sweeping generalities and painting large swaths of people with a broad brush. When I speak of your generation-you may agree or disagree that it applies to you. You may be an outlier. Please know that sociologists will use different names and dates for age groupings. The ones below are the names and dates that I will be using:

The G.I. Generation<br>The Silent Generation<br>Baby Boomers<br>Generation X<br>Millennials<br>Generation Z<br>Generation Alpha

> (born 1901-1927) The Greatest Generation $(1928-1945)$ $(1946-1964)$ The Me Generation $(1965-1980)$ $(1981-1996)$ (1h Generation, or Boomerangs $(1997-2010)$ Zoomers (2011-present)

Generations can be grouped together by various factors. Age would be the biggest. However, you might not identify with people born in your age bracket. One of your children may be listed as a GenX and the next child born a year later would be a Millennial. It's ridiculous to think that they would be that much different. The other terms I have seen with generational studies are 'leading edge' and 'trailing edge.' If you were born in the first couple years of your generation, you would be considered 'leading edge.' At the tail end of your cohort, you would be 'trailing edge.'
Where were you...?
Pearl Harbor was a defining 'flashbulb' moment for the G.I. Generation. The assassination of JFK was the same for Baby Boomers. The space shuttle for GenX and perhaps $9 / 11$ for Millennials were pivotal generation defining moments. This isn't to say that every generation didn't experience those things in the same way-but they were foundational early experiences for one generation.
The point of this exercise is to gain understanding. If you know where someone else is coming from, hopefully you can see things from their angle. No two persons are the same, and ten people can all have different reactions to the same event. I pray that this will give us all insight and inspire empathy, conversation, and community. Because our congregation is made up of many generations it provides us with a rich tapestry of culture, context, and diversity. During Lent, we will explore what this means and how it affects us all in our church.

## Lenten Book Study:

On each Tuesday night of Lent, beginning on Tuesday, February 20- we are having our Lenten Book Study. This year we are reading and discussing "Salvation NOT Purchased: Overcoming the Ransom Idea to Rediscover the Original Gospel Teaching," by Stephen Finlan.
The book is a critique of the traditional atonement understanding that 'Christ died for our sins.' It looks at the implications of the traditional orthodox teaching of what "washed in the blood" theology has meant over the years.
If you didn't follow much of what I just wrote, then definitely pick up a copy of the book and come to the discussion group. It is not a long book (only 86 pages), but it is incredibly thoughtful and well researched. I believe it is accessible for anyone at any level of theological education (including none). Because we'll meet for 5 or 6 weeks to discuss the material, we can take our time and have amazing conversations.

In his column Mr. Gay wrote that The Rev. Carole Baker explained why the church was called Central Congregational Church. At the time the church was formed, there was a great discussion about what the church was to be named. It seems that no member was in favor of becoming the Third Congregational Church. The decision was made to call themselves Central Congregational Church and it is to this day.
My thanks go out to Peter for bringing this story to light.
