PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I wonder if on Holy Saturday (the day before Easter)—the disciples had given up hope on that Messiah thing. They saw Jesus being led away to crucifixion. Some even saw him being nailed to the cross. They all knew he died and was laid in a sealed tomb. They must have thought the dream had ended. The man they had followed for 3 years was gone—dead and buried. Easter came and changed everything.

I wonder also if the disciples sat around and thought, "Oh great, now what are we going to do?" This is how I imagine the meeting: Peter got out some parchment and a couple of colorful sharpies and began to lead the group in a discernment process. They needed to come up with a plan. They didn't know how to worship Jesus Christ. They didn't know how to be hospitable and inviting to those who wanted to join their new religion. They didn't know which boards and committees they should have. They needed a Vision Statement! They needed By-Laws!

Jesus tried to empower their leadership and now they had no choice. They had to be the leaders. Jesus was the holy consultant: sharing information, new commandments, parables and teachings. The disciples were supposed to take that information and create and lead a church. Quite frankly, their leader never really told them or taught them how to plant a church. So, they set up an easel and began to brainstorm about what "church" should look like.

Churches need to do this! We have a tremendous advantage! We already have 2000 years of Christian history and tradition to rely on, and our own church has over 320 years of history in this community being the church. However, it takes an incredible amount of faith. Those first disciples must have had awe-inspiring faith to believe that they could take the church to the farthest reaches of the globe and share their message. He invited the disciples to participate in the resurrection. Jesus wants participants. He wanted the disciples to say, "What's next?"

Leonard Sweet. in his book, *The Gospel According to Starbucks*, uses the expression 'pew-potatoes' (a play on the expression 'couch potato'). He speaks of churches where the congregation has become lukewarm, middle of the road, non-risk takers. Pew potato churches are content to be content. Jesus went through a lot for the pew potato types.

It takes <u>an act of holy boldness</u> to come back from the dead. It takes an act of holy boldness to leave a church to 11 dense, dim disciples. It takes an act of holy boldness to leave that room and preach the gospel. It takes an act of holy boldness to tell others about **our** faith and **our** church. It takes an act of holy boldness to grow in our spirituality. God loves vigorous and audacious faith.

It is time for us to act and live with holy boldness. It's time for us to demonstrate a vigorous and audacious faith. Let us live into our Easter faith! He is risen. Let us rise to the occasion.

Why is the Ladies Parlor called just that? Well, to tell the truth, I don't It seems that most really know. everyone who might have known has passed on. There may be someone who knows, and if so I would like to hear from them. In lieu of hard facts I can only speculate. The first thing that comes to my mind is that the church was built at the turn of the last century and women were not empowered with the right to vote. It only seems to reason that that when there was a business or financial meeting it was conducted in the sanctuary and the ladies were excused to the parlor. There were also several other reasons for this banishment; there was a working fireplace in the room. I saw a picture of the room at about that time and it looked very different from the way we see it. There was no rug and there were no stained glass windows. The furniture was a lot different too, very plain and didn't seem to be very comfortable.

Today, bridal parties wait in there until their big entrance and there is that amazing full length mirror for some final checks of flowers and gowns. The Ladies Parlor also happens to be the warmest room because it's the first room to get heat from the furnace.

Born three days apart, ancestry flowing through the same portal of History, Richmond, VA, Reggie Harris and Greg Greenway are on a pilgrimage together - one that began three decades ago. The racial divisions that are the reality of America started them in two different worlds, but the amazing bonds of music, respect, admiration, and shared vision have brought them together as friends and colleagues. The musical and spiritual blooming of this history has become Deeper Than The Skin, the telling of their stories through words and music. It is a great American story, informative inspiring in so many ways. Building bridges couldn't be more important at this moment in history. How to face struggles with hope, and even joy, is the gift they have to give.





Who knew, when a young J. Kimball Darling was hired in the late 1960's as Second Church organist and choir director, what a great and lasting impact



he would have on the music scene in Attleboro. He guided the church in purchasing our wonderful pipe organ, and established a

marvelous choral program that continues to this day under the direction of Dr. William MacPherson. Then, in 1983, Kimball was approached by a group of friends, some of them Attleboro High School graduates who had fallen in love with choral music as members of the award winning AHS "A

Cappella Choir". Kimball and the young singers gathered one evening to sing some madrigals. They decided to make this a regular event, and called themselves "Oure Pleasure", borrowing those words from madrigal lyrics they had just sung.

Fast forward decades! The Oure Pleasure Singers, themselves award winners in WGBH's program "Sing That Thing", have been going strong all these years and are celebrating 40 years of friendship and music making. In May the group will look back over their decades together through songs and The performance, under the stories. baton of director Nicholas Rocha, will be made up of favorite pieces from four decades, so this concert will have something for everyone – Renaissance music aficionados to Disney fans. The concert will even spotlight some Attleboro composers.
