#### Pastor's Message

Doesn't it seem that anytime we buy something these days we question the 'hidden costs?'

A pool seems like a good idea, but then there is the cost of chemicals, maintenance and the surge in the electricity bill. There are hidden costs with every purchase today—everything from a college education to a gas grill. How many times have you brought something home from the store only to realize you didn't get everything you needed with the product? So, it's back out to the store you go.

One time I got a great deal on a drum set. It was a good deal on the drums—but then I needed to buy cymbals and the hardware (stands, pedal, sticks). What started out as a great deal—turned out, wasn't so great.

Did you ever take your car to be serviced (I hope you have)? One time I brought my car into the station for a routine oil change. When all was said and done, that oil change cost me—are you ready for this--\$1100.00! I did not place the decimal point in the wrong spot. I'll even make it more clear--\$1,100. I am not lamenting the price of oil—it's just that my car needed more work than I could have imagined. One simple oil change turned into an epic list of things that I absolutely had to do if I truly loved my family, who would be riding with me in that car. Who wouldn't get the brakes fixed, after all?

While I was waiting, I was looking at a new car invoice. The car came with all these 'options.' Many of them were kind of silly, I thought. They could charge you for special paint. They used to charge you for undercoating and rust protection (remember those days?). Dealerships would try to upsell you—even though every car on the lot came with rust-proofing. My least favorite 'hidden cost' is the destination charge! They charge you—to get the car on their lot!

In the church there are hidden costs. Look around the next time you go to worship, or visit the church. Everything you see, or can touch, came at a cost. It cost someone dearly. The pews, the carpet, the organ, the classrooms, the heating system, etc. People worked tirelessly at fairs, yard sales, suppers, pops concerts! They baked, knitted or crafted at home for countless hours leading up to church fundraising events. Then there were so many over the last 275 years who made financial contributions to the church, or worked tirelessly shoveling coal, raking leaves, changing lightbulbs, showing up for meetings, etc. People were incredibly kind over the years leaving the church in their wills. I don't know everything that goes on in the church—because there is the 'hidden cost.' Things get done and we don't know who does them.

I suppose this happens in every organization, event and social club. But the church is different, because of a greater hidden cost. But the hidden cost isn't and has never been a secret. Jesus died on the cross. It's not secret. His mission to share the gospel of love cost him his life. It is not secret, but for many of us, we keep it a secret.

The next time that you are in church, remember that there isn't one thing about our church that has ever been easy or without a cost. Just getting to worship for some takes a great cost. Don't let your faith be hidden. May God bless you as you remember the cost and the joy of discipleship.
