From the Pastor's Desk:

I am writing this when I am supposed to be preparing for Christmas Sunday. The theme of the worship service is supposed to be love, but I am having a hard time focusing on love...I have been trying to process the recent mass shootings. We often say, "thoughts and prayers." God knows I have been praying. So here are a few of my thoughts...

What are the major contributing factors in mass shootings.

1. Guns 2. Mental Health problems 3. Hate

That's pretty much it. Each one of those points is multi-layered and has their own set of contributing factors. Perhaps you have more/different contributing factors. The first two factors on my list will probably be around for the duration of our lifetimes and unless something is done to curb those factors, my guess is that they will only get worse.

Then there is HATE—what can we do about that? Hate is taught. Children learn it. It is reinforced. Each side of the aisle blames the other side for sowing division with hate rhetoric. We talk about hate speech and hate crimes, but ultimately, you can't legislate LOVE.

Hate is a pretty strong word—and most of us don't think of ourselves as haters. However, hate manifests in subtle ways. It festers. It grows. It poisons. It may start as a joke or an innocent jibe. It could be as loud as a bullhorn or as piercing as a dog whistle. Hate is spewed from podiums and pulpits. It comes from our peers, parents and programs. And we have a new forum for all generations, the internet and social media. Sorry Baby Boomers—Facebook is a festering cesspool of pathetic pandering to the echo chamber. (But it probably has some good stuff too.)

Those little barbs and snide comments that your favorite talking head makes—

Those caustic tweets, offensive memes and provocative posts are seeds of hate.

Those things that may make you smile because they are directed at someone you don't like, generate an atmosphere of division and negativity.

It seems like a huge leap to go from subtle remarks to violence. However, when the subtle is compounded and reinforced—it isn't so strange. Do you know when a theory is a conspiracy theory? Are you able to tell if a picture or story is AI generated? Are you able to tell the difference between the truth and 'fake news?' We all think we can, but it is more difficult every day.

We are all wrestling with uncertainty. We are all carrying a lot. Folks who are struggling with their mental health have an even harder time and may take off-hand comments as biblical truth.

This year—be mindful of the things that you put out there. Your posts—your words—your comments matter. We need to put more love into the universe. Only love can overcome hate. Try to share God's love with all who cross your path or read your posts. If you should hear, read or experience the subtle seeds of hate—speak the truth of LOVE.
